## Giving

### **2 Corinthians 8:7**

<sup>7</sup> But since you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in complete earnestness and in the love we have kindled in you see that you also excel in this grace of giving.

### **1 Timothy 6:18-19**

<sup>18</sup> *Instruct them* to do good, to be rich in good works, to be generous and ready to share, <sup>19</sup> storing up for themselves the treasure of a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of that which is life indeed.

### **Proverbs 3:9-10**

<sup>9</sup> Honor the LORD from your wealth and from the first of all your produce;  
<sup>10</sup> So your barns will be filled with plenty and your vats will overflow with new wine.

### **1 Chronicles 29:11-12**

<sup>11</sup> Yours, O LORD, is the greatness and the power and the glory and the victory and the majesty, indeed everything that is in the heavens and the earth; Yours is the dominion, O LORD, and You exalt Yourself as head over all. <sup>12</sup> Both riches and honor *come* from You, and You rule over all, and in Your hand is power and might; and it lies in Your hand to make great and to strengthen everyone.

### **Luke 6:38**

<sup>38</sup> Give and it will be given to you. They will pour into your lap a good measure—pressed down, shaken together, *and* running over. For by your standard of measure it will be measured to you in return.”

### **Romans 11:34-35**

<sup>34</sup> FOR WHO HAS KNOWN THE MIND OF THE LORD, OR WHO BECAME HIS COUNSELOR? <sup>35</sup> OR WHO HAS FIRST GIVEN TO HIM THAT IT MIGHT BE PAID BACK TO HIM AGAIN?

### **Matthew 25:23**

<sup>23</sup> His master said to him, ‘Well done, good and faithful slave. You were faithful with a few things, I will put you in charge of many things; enter into the joy of your master.’

# Debt

## **Proverbs 22:7**

<sup>7</sup> The rich rules over the poor, and the borrower *becomes* the lender's slave.

## **Psalm 37:21**

<sup>21</sup> The wicked borrows and does not pay back, but the righteous is gracious and gives.

## **Hebrews 13:5**

<sup>5</sup> *Make sure that* your character is free from the love of money, being content with what you have; for He Himself has said, "I WILL NEVER DESERT YOU, NOR WILL I EVER FORSAKE YOU,"

## **Deuteronomy 28:12**

<sup>12</sup> The LORD will open for you His good storehouse, the heavens, to give rain to your land in its season and to bless all the work of your hand; and you shall lend to many nations, but you shall not borrow.

## **Deuteronomy 28:44**

<sup>44</sup> He shall lend to you, but you will not lend to him; he shall be the head, and you will be the tail.

## **James 4:13-14**

<sup>13</sup> Come now, you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go to such and such a city, and spend a year there and engage in business and make a profit." <sup>14</sup> yet you do not know <sup>[b]</sup> what your life will be like tomorrow. You are *just* a vapor that appears for a little while and then vanishes away.

## **Ecclesiastes 5:5**

<sup>5</sup> It is better that you should not vow than that you should vow and not pay.

# Taxes

## Romans 13:6-7

<sup>6</sup> For because of this you also pay taxes, for *rulers* are servants of God, devoting themselves to this very thing. <sup>7</sup> Render to all what is due them: tax to whom tax *is due*; custom to whom custom; fear to whom fear; honor to whom honor.

## Romans 13:1-2

Every person is to be in subjection to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and those which exist are established by God. <sup>2</sup> Therefore whoever resists authority has opposed the ordinance of God; and they who have opposed will receive condemnation upon themselves.

## Matthew 22:17-21

<sup>17</sup> Tell us then, what do You think? Is it lawful to give a poll-tax to Caesar, or not?" <sup>18</sup> But Jesus perceived their malice, and said, "Why are you testing Me, you hypocrites? <sup>19</sup> Show Me the coin *used* for the poll-tax." And they brought Him a denarius. <sup>20</sup> And He said to them, "Whose likeness and inscription is this?" <sup>21</sup> They said to Him, "Caesar's." Then He said to them, "Then render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's; and to God the things that are God's."

## Matthew 17:24-27

<sup>24</sup> When they came to Capernaum, those who collected the <sup>[a]</sup>two-drachma *tax* came to Peter and said, "Does your teacher not pay the <sup>[b]</sup>two-drachma *tax*?" <sup>25</sup> He \*said, "Yes." And when he came into the house, Jesus spoke to him first, saying, "What do you think, Simon? From whom do the kings of the earth collect customs or poll-tax, from their sons or from strangers?" <sup>26</sup> When Peter said, "From strangers," Jesus said to him, "Then the sons are <sup>[c]</sup>exempt. <sup>27</sup> However, so that we do not <sup>[d]</sup>offend them, go to the sea and throw in a hook, and take the first fish that comes up; and when you open its mouth, you will find <sup>[e]</sup>a shekel. Take that and give it to them for you and Me."

# Managing Living Expenses

## **1 Timothy 6:17**

<sup>17</sup> Instruct those who are rich in this present world not to be conceited or to fix their hope on the uncertainty of riches, but on God, who richly supplies us with all things to enjoy.

## **Proverbs 27:23**

<sup>23</sup> Know well the condition of your flocks, *and* pay attention to your herds;

## **Proverbs 23:4-5**

<sup>4</sup> Do not weary yourself to gain wealth, Cease from your consideration *of it*.

<sup>5</sup> When you set your eyes on it, it is gone. For *wealth* certainly makes itself wings like an eagle that flies *toward* the heavens.

## **Matthew 6:11**

<sup>11</sup> 'Give us this day our daily bread.

## **Proverbs 30:8-9**

<sup>8</sup> Keep deception and lies far from me, Give me neither poverty nor riches;  
Feed me with the food that is my portion,

<sup>9</sup> That I not be full and deny *You* and say, "Who is the LORD?"

Or that I not be in want and steal, And profane the name of my God.

## **Psalms 127:2**

<sup>2</sup> It is vain for you to rise up early, to retire late,

To eat the bread of painful labors; for He gives to His beloved *even in his* sleep.

## **Proverbs 6:6-8**

<sup>6</sup> Go to the ant, O sluggard, Observe her ways and be wise,

<sup>7</sup> Which, having no chief, Officer or ruler,

<sup>8</sup> Prepares her food in the summer *and* gathers her provision in the harvest.

## **1 Timothy 5:8**

# Saving

## **Proverbs 21:20**

## **Genesis 41:47-49**

<sup>47</sup> During the seven years of plenty the land brought forth abundantly. So he gathered all the food of *these* seven years which occurred in the land of Egypt and placed the food in the cities; he placed in every city the food from its own surrounding fields. <sup>49</sup> Thus Joseph stored up grain in great abundance like the sand of the sea, until he stopped measuring *it*, for it was beyond measure.

## **Matthew 6:19-20**

<sup>19</sup> "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. <sup>20</sup> But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves do not break in or steal;

## **Proverbs 10:4-5**

<sup>4</sup> Poor is he who works with a negligent hand, But the hand of the diligent makes rich.  
<sup>5</sup> He who gathers in summer is a son who acts wisely, *But* he who sleeps in harvest is a son who acts shamefully.

## **Proverbs 13:11**
